

Adrian Parr is an internationally recognized environmental, political, and cultural thinker and activist. She is the Dean of the College of Design at the University of Oregon and is a Senior Fellow of the Design Futures Council. She has served for eight years as a UNESCO water chair.

Parr is a writer, public speaker, community organizer, and filmmaker. She has published numerous books and articles.
