

Denise Rush, FASID, IIDA, IDEC, is Dean, of the School of Interior Architecture, at Boston Architectural College (the BAC). She is responsible for developing and executing the vision for the, CIDA accredited, first professional Bachelor and Master of Interior Architecture programs, and the online post-graduate Master of Science in Interior Architecture. Denise works with a core group of adjunct faculty members championing design education that aligns with professional practice. To meet the challenges of providing a design education in an open enrollment institution, she practices and encourages innovative modes of teaching supporting the pedagogy of the curriculum in traditional; hybrid studio/classroom; and virtual modalities.

Prior to moving to Boston to join the BAC, she was an adjunct professor of Interior Architecture in the Art + Design department of Columbia College Chicago. Her prior professional practice work includes being the Visiting Interior Designer at the University of Illinois at Urbana-Champaign; interiors director at Perkins & Will (Chicago); interiors project manager at SmithGroup (Detroit); and head of interior design at TowerPinkster (Grand Rapids).

She holds a Master of Science in Nonprofit Management from Spertus Institute of Jewish Leadership in Chicago, and a Bachelor of Arts degree in interior design from Michigan State University.

Denise is currently serving on the national board of directors of the American Society of Interior Designers and is a trustee of the ASID Foundation.
