Ken P. Yocom, PhD is an Associate Professor and Chair of the Department of Landscape Architecture at the University of Washington - Seattle. He earned his PhD in the Built Environments and a Master of Landscape Architecture from the University of Washington - Seattle, and his BS in Vertebrate Zoology - Wildlife Ecology from Eastern Washington University. His professional work and scholarly investigations navigate the intersections of environmental conservation and social justice in cities and he has written extensively on issues of urban environmental justice, critical urban geographies, and more-than-human perspectives in planning and design. He is the co-author of *Ecological Design* (2012) a primer for the integration of ecological understanding into design practice, and the co-editor of *NOW Urbanism: The Future City is Here* (2015) which presents a counter-narrative for rethinking and remaking today's cities and region exploring the intersections of critical urbanism and immediate, substantive actions. More recently he served as the section editor on water for the coedited *Handbook of Sustainable Cities and Landscapes in the Pacific Rim* (2022) with contributions which interrogate the relations between community justice and urban politics in urban water management.
