Kevin Van Den Wymelenberg serves as dean and professor at the University of Nebraska College of Architecture. He was formerly the director for the School of Architecture and Environment, and Associate Dean for Research at the University of Oregon College of Design. He founded the Institute for Health in the Built Environment at the UO in 2018 and the Integrated Design Lab at the University of Idaho in 2004. He also directed the Biology and the Built Environment Center and Energy Studies in Buildings Laboratories with at the University of Oregon. His research seeks to facilitate integration amongst a broad network of researchers and practitioners on issues concerning health, comfort, and sustainability in the human ecosystem in order to support human, community and planetary health. He has completed or secured over \$40M in funded research and creative activity related to indoor environmental quality and energy efficiency for organizations such as the Economic Development Administration, the National Science Foundation, United States Environment Protection Agency, United States Department of Energy, United States Department of Agriculture, The Alfred P. Sloan Foundation, the Northwest Energy Efficiency Alliance and several private companies. He has published over 100 peer-reviewed articles and presented over 300 invited lectures.
