

Nancy Pollock-Ellwand, Ph.D., FCSLA, is proud to be the dean of the College of Architecture, Planning and Landscape Architecture (CAPLA) at the University of Arizona. She has also served as Dean of the Faculty of Environmental Design, University of Calgary; and Head and Chair of the School of Architecture and Built Environment (now named) at the University of Adelaide, Australia.

Pollock-Ellwand received a diverse professional education in Canada with a BLA, MArch, and PhD in planning; but finds her professional home in landscape architecture. She has an extensive background in cultural landscapes with research centering on the history of landscapes and urban reform. A book is currently in preparation on the Olmsted Firm and how their principles of design and planning took root in Canada.

Pollock-Ellwand most recently served as Co-Chair of the UNESCO International Council on Monuments and Sites' (ICOMOS) Evaluation Panel for new World Heritage sites (2018/20 to 2020/21, and panel member 2016 through 2018). As a member of the ICOMOS/ International Federation of Landscape Architects' (IFLA) Scientific Committee on Cultural Landscapes she served in an advisory capacity. This work has underscored for her the importance of cultural literacy and empathy across a diversity of heritage sites: from the reindeer hunting lands of the Sami people in Norway, and the sacred mountains of Bhutan; to the tower houses of Saudi Arabia, and the storied coastline of SW Japan.
