Robert Alexander González is the Dean of the School of Architecture & Planning (SA+P) at the University of New Mexico. He is also President-Elect of the Association of Collegiate Schools of Architecture (ACSA), assuming the role of President in 2021-2022, and he serves on the Board of Directors of The Architecture Lobby (TAL). From 2011-2020, Dr. González was the Director of the Texas Tech El Paso Program, located on the US-Mexico border in the historic 1906 Daniel H. Burnham Union Depot train station. This architecture and historic preservation program serves students from the states of Texas, Chihuahua, and New Mexico. An award-winning Professor of Architecture, he is a tireless advocate for equity and diversity in higher education.
